





The Opioid Epidemic






Total Opioid Pills Prescribed 2019 - 2022

Total Opioid Prescriptions 2019 - 2022


25% decrease in opioid prescriptions





Short 1:1 meeting Uses evidencebased resources Tailored to address gaps in knowledge

GOAL: behavior change



Academic Detailing Data: 2022

Number of meetings with providers:	320 +
Specialties:	FM, Med/Peds, IM, Ortho PAs, Psych APRNs & ALL providers in the Emergency Department
Topics discussed:	PDMP, Opioid Risk Tool, Referrals, LAWS, policy, guidelines, Co- Prescribing, Naloxone and MAT

What is MOUD/MAT



Stigma Against Medication

Belief that medications "trade one addiction for another".

"A lot of people don't consider someone sober if they are on [medications], but I am more productive, kinder, more hardworking, and much more attentive...Different things work for different people."

EMILY BROCKWAY

Relieves withdrawal symptoms & cravings

Normalizes brain chemistry

Blocks euphoric effects

Manages uncomfortable cravings

Normalizes body functions

Used in conjunction with other behavioral health services

NOT intended as stand-alone treatment

Total Outreach by Department: 2022




